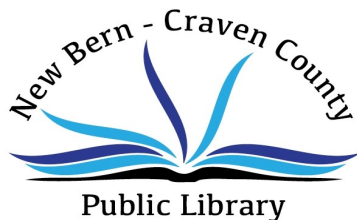

Free Technology Classes:

Tech Tutor* ~ Sign-up for a one-on-one tech session with a staff member. Ask at the Reference Desk for available days and times.

March 1: iPhone Basics* ~ 2:30-4:00 p.m. ~ Learn how to use your iPhone (any generation), including: contacts, apps, phone, and eBooks. No computer skills necessary, but an iPhone is required.

March 6: Windows 10* ~ 2:30-4:00 p.m. ~ Learn the basics of navigating the Windows 10 operating system, such as changing PC settings, customizing tiles on the start menu, switching apps, and shutting down. Basic computer skills are required. You may bring your own Windows 10 device or use a library laptop.

March 7 & 9: Beginning Internet* ~ 10:15-11:30 a.m. ~ This is a 2-day class. The class is designed for new computer users who want to be introduced to the mouse and keyboard, Internet searching, email, printing, and the library's online catalog. No computer skills are required.

March 7: eBay Basics* ~ 6:30-8:00 p.m. ~ This class covers the eBay auction site with emphasis on: finding items, selling, PayPal, and security issues. Basic computer skills are required, but an eBay account is not needed.

March 15: Android Tablets* ~ 2:30-4:00 p.m. ~ Learn how to use your Android Tablet—Google Nexus, Samsung Galaxy, or other Android device (except Kindle Fire). The class will also cover eBooks. No computer skills necessary, but an Android Tablet is required.

March 20: iPad Basics* ~ 2:30-4:00 p.m. ~ Students will learn how to use their iPad—basic functions, apps, and eBooks. No computer skills necessary, but an iPad or iPad Mini (any generation) is required.

March 29: Kindle Fire Basics* ~ 2:30-4:00 p.m. ~ This class will cover the basics of the Kindle Fire tablet—basic functions, apps, and eBooks. No computer skills necessary, but a Kindle Fire (any version) or Fire Phone is required.
