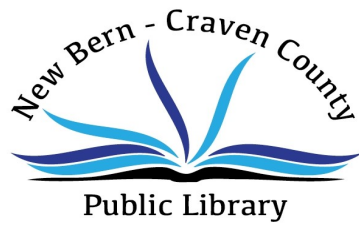

### Technology Classes:

(Classes meet in the Conference Room unless otherwise noted)

**Tech Tutor\* ~** Sign-up for a one-on-one tech session with a staff member. Ask at the Reference Desk for available days and times.

**June 6 & 8: Beginning Internet\* ~ 10:00-11:30 p.m.** ~ This is a 2-day class. The class is designed for new computer users who want to be introduced to the mouse and keyboard, Internet searching, email, printing, and the library online catalog. No computer skills required.

**June 7: Kindle Fire Basics\* ~ 2:30-4:00 p.m.** ~ This class will cover the basics of the Kindle Fire tablet—basic functions, apps, and eBooks. No computer skills necessary, but a Kindle Fire (any version) or Fire Phone is required.

**June 12: Facebook 101\* ~ 2:30-4:00 p.m.** ~ Students will learn about the Facebook social networking site – finding friends, liking pages, and security issues. Basic computer skills are required, but a Facebook account is not needed.

**June 13: iPad Basics\* ~ 6:30-7:45 p.m.** ~ Students will learn to use their iPad—basic functions, apps, and eBooks. No computer skills are necessary, but an iPad or iPad Mini (any generation) is required.

**June 21: Windows 10\* ~ 2:30-4:00 p.m.** ~ Learn the basics of navigating the Windows 10 operating system, such as changing PC settings, customizing tiles on the start menu, switching apps, and shutting down. Basic computer skills are required. You may bring your own Windows 10 device or use a library laptop.

**June 28: Android Tablets\* ~ 2:30-4:00 p.m.** ~ Learn how to use your Android Tablet—Google Nexus, Samsung Galaxy, or other Android device (except Kindle Fire). The class will also cover eBooks. No computer skills necessary, but an Android tablet is required.
