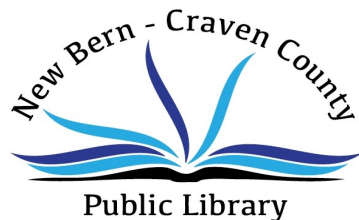

Free Technology Classes:
