- 9:30 – 10:30 **When the Sources Are Wrong:** A problem every genealogist has to deal with in research and what to do to solve the problems that erroneous sources present. Many problems presented by new technology are also discussed, as well as the strengths and dangerous flaws in the genealogical tools we all commonly use like the IGI and the internet.

- 1:30 – 2:30 **Family Tradition: How to Separate Fact from Fiction in Genealogical Research:** The case history of Jost Hite - so-called "Baron of the Shenandoah Valley" - is examined, dissected, and made relevant to all; that Hite was eventually discovered to be the son of the local butcher in his ancestral European village - not a Baron at all - should be no surprise to experienced genealogists.
